We received in donations 1809k (Supermarkets 37% individuals 27% harvest 5% Street 19% and religion 5%.

We gave out 1568k, 1483k to feed 140 clients on 70 vouchers, and 85k to other foodbanks and out of date.

During October we feed 613 clients 397 adults 216 children on 310 vouchers
